The Civil Service Commission's budget incorporates the budgets of two other bodies; the Office of the Commissioner for Public Appointments, and the Advisory Committee on Business Appointments, because they share a secretariat.

Table 1 shows the budget for the direct cost of the Civil Service Commission (incorporating life chances work, carried out under the Going Forward into Employment scheme). Table 2 shows the budget directly attributed to the other bodies incorporated into CSC's secretariat function. Table 3 shows the budget for the cost of the shared secretariat, of which approximately 70% relates to CSC work (determined following a work sampling exercise agreed with the National Audit Office). Figures are to the nearest £1,000.
